Maryland State Board of Elections Announces 565,639 Voters Have Requested Mail-In Ballots for the 2026 Primary Election

First Phase of Ballot Mailings Will Be Mailed by Monday, May 11

ANNAPOLIS (May 5, 2026) — The Maryland State Board of Elections today announced that 565,639 voters have already requested mail-in ballots for the 2026 Primary Election. The SBE will begin transmitting Primary Election Ballots to voters who are eligible to vote in the primary election and requested a ballot in advance by Monday, May 11. For ballots sent by mail, it is expected that voters will receive their ballot within five days.

There is still time to request a mail-in ballot. To receive a ballot via mail or fax, your request must be received (not just mailed) or submitted [online](#) by Tuesday, June 16. To receive your mail-in ballot via email, submit your request [online](#) no later than Friday, June 19.

To ensure the secure transmittal of mail-in ballots, voters can verify that their [local board of elections](#) received their mail-in ballot request and can track the status of their ballot by visiting SBE's [voter look-up website](#). If you want to receive and vote a mail-in ballot for all future Federal and State elections, sign up for the permanent mail-in ballot list using the mail-in ballot application.

“Voters who want to utilize mail-in ballots should request their ballot early to ensure you have plenty of time to return your voted ballot,” said Jared DeMarinis, State Administrator of Elections. “Mail-in ballots are convenient, secure, and trusted method of voting. Maryland employs tracking technology on the ballots ensuring confidence in the integrity of mail-in voting. Remember that ballot drop boxes are a great way to return your mail-in ballot.”

To return your voted mail-in ballot, the ballot must be postmarked by or before 8 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, June 23. If returned by hand, ballots must be dropped at a secure ballot drop box or local board of elections by 8 p.m. on Tuesday, June 23.

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Maryland State Board of Elections Encourages Marylanders to Explore the Benefits of Serving as Election Judges and Election Pages

ANNAPOLIS (May 12, 2026) — [The Maryland State Board of Elections](#) (SBE) is calling on eligible Marylanders to take part in the 2026 Primary Election by serving as election judges and election pages.

There are several benefits to serving as an election judge. Eligible Marylanders aged 16 and older can earn money and help other residents cast their votes by serving as election judges. Those who have previously served as an Election Judge are eligible for a one-time \$100 bonus payment. Election judges check in voters, provide guidance and answer questions, and help oversee a smooth voting experience. To apply to be an election judge, [use SBE's online form](#) or contact your [local Board of Elections](#). It is vital to SBE operations to have an adequate number of Election Judges on call, in the event that there are last minute cancellations and to help begin recruitment for the 2026 General Election cycle.

Additionally, eligible 14-15-year-olds can serve as Election Day Pages. Pages are student volunteers who, under the direction of Chief Election Judges, assist Election Judges and voters on Election Day. To become an Election Day Page, [apply using our online form](#) or contact your [local Board of Elections](#). Serving as an election page also provides students with an opportunity to earn service-learning credit hours for school.

“Election judges and pages are essential to the success of Maryland’s elections and the strength of our democratic process,” said State Administrator Jared DeMarinis. “Their service helps ensure every voter can cast a ballot confidently and that every vote is counted accurately, fairly, and securely. Election judges also play a crucial role in maintaining the integrity and security of elections across the state. For younger Marylanders, serving as an election page offers a unique and rewarding introduction to the election process and civic engagement. I encourage all eligible Marylanders to consider serving their communities as election judges or election pages and help protect the voting rights of their fellow citizens.”

State of Maryland employees and county government employees who are scheduled to be an election judge can earn administrative leave. Be sure to check with your employer for any added benefits of serving as an election judge.

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Maryland State Board of Elections Addresses an Error with Mail-In Ballots

ANNAPOLIS (May 15, 2026) — [The Maryland State Board of Elections](#) has been made aware of an error by our mail-in ballot vendor resulting in some voters receiving the wrong party ballot for the Gubernatorial Primary Election.

In order to maintain the highest level of confidence and accuracy in mail-in voting, SBE is working with the vendor to send replacement mail-in ballots. While it is possible only a small number of voters received the wrong ballot, and most voters received the correct ballot, all voters must be issued a replacement ballot. This action of resending ballots maintains the integrity and security of mail-in voting.

This error affects only voters who were mailed a ballot before May 14, 2026. If a voter requested and received their mail-in ballot by web delivery (Print at Home ballot), their ballot will not be affected. All affected voters will be notified.

“We are diligently working to address this error and provide clear instructions to those affected as quickly as possible,” said Maryland State Administrator of Elections, Jared DeMarinis. “The State and Local Boards of Elections remain committed to running an election that is verified, secure and accurate. Mail-in voting is an integral facet of the electoral process. With over 500,000 voters requesting mail-in ballots, we want to eliminate any doubt in its integrity or accuracy that is why I have arranged the sending of replacement ballots.”

Mr. DeMarinis emphasized, “Please be assured that we are actively answering phones and responding to emails and will remain transparent as we navigate through this situation. We will make every effort to ensure that everyone affected knows the situation and how to cast their ballot. Every vote matters, your voice will be heard, and our elections will remain verified, open, transparent, and secure.”

SBE understands that this situation might cause the spread of misinformation. Please remember to rely on election officials as your trusted sources for election information.

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Taylor Print & Visual Impressions, Inc.'s Statement Regarding Mail Ballot Printing Error

Taylor Print & Visual Impressions, Inc. ("TPVI") recently became aware of an issue involving the incorrect distribution of ballot materials in connection with a primary election mailing. Specifically, a portion of voters received ballot packets intended for a different voter segment.

We understand the seriousness of this matter and the importance of accuracy and trust in all election-related communications. Upon identifying the issue, we immediately began working closely with our customer and election officials to investigate the cause, implement corrective actions, and support the timely delivery of accurate materials to affected voters.

We have implemented additional quality control and verification measures to help prevent this type of issue from occurring in the future.

At TPVI, we are committed to maintaining the highest standards of security, precision, and operational integrity, and we regret the confusion this situation may have caused.

Frequently Asked Questions

Is there a risk of duplicate voting because of this error?

No. There is no risk of duplicate voting as a result of this issue. Election officials have safeguards in place to ensure that only the corrected ballots included in the replacement mailing will be accepted and counted.

When will I receive my new ballot?

Replacement ballots are currently being prepared and mailed. All ballots will be remailed by 5/29/2026. Additional updates will be communicated by election officials as they become available.

What should I do with my original ballot?

Voters should securely discard or destroy the original ballot materials they received and use only the replacement ballot sent in the new mailing.

Will my vote still count?

Yes. Eligible voters who complete and return their replacement ballot in accordance with election instructions will have their vote counted.

What is being done to prevent this from happening again?

We are conducting a full review of the issue and implementing additional verification and quality control measures to strengthen accuracy and help prevent similar situations in the future.



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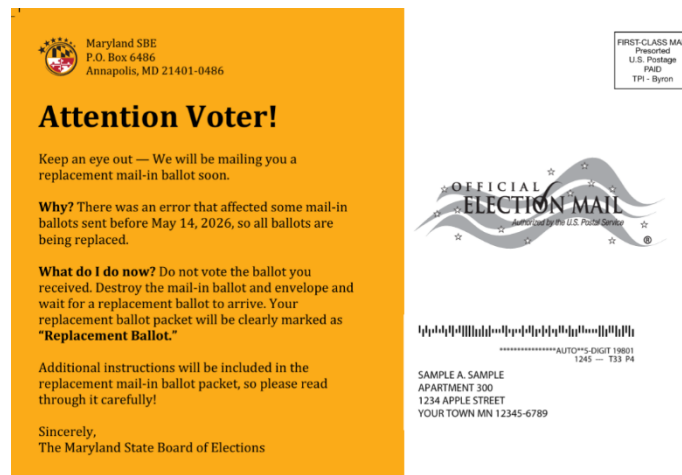
The Maryland State Board of Elections Shares More Information and Next Steps Regarding Mail-In Ballots

ANNAPOLIS (May 18, 2026) — ANNAPOLIS (May 18, 2026) - As stated on May 15, 2026, the [Maryland State Board of Elections](https://www.elections.maryland.gov) (SBE) has been made aware of a printing error by our mail-in ballot vendor for the Maryland 2026 Gubernatorial Primary Election scheduled for June 23, 2026. The following provides more information to Maryland voters and other stakeholders about next steps with mail-in ballots.

Beginning on May 9, 2026, mail-in ballots were sent out to all voters that requested them on or before May 6, 2026. While some voters may have received the correct ballot and party affiliation as they are registered, an error in the coding with SBE's mail-in ballot vendor resulted in some voters receiving the wrong party ballot. Since the mail-in vendor was unable to accurately identify who received correct ballots and who did not receive correct ballots, SBE determined the only course of action to ensure the integrity and security of mail-in voting was sending all voters who requested a mail-in ballot by mail a new ballot.

Notify all affected voters

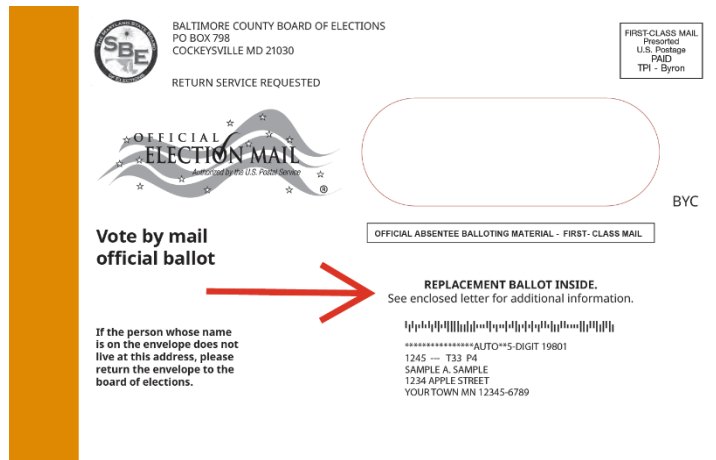
All voters who will receive a replacement ballot will be sent a postcard to the same address where they receive their ballot. Additionally, if the voter receives emails or texts from SBE, they will be notified using their preferred method of contact that they will receive a replacement ballot. Communications with voters will begin on Monday, May 18, 2026.

Replacement Ballots

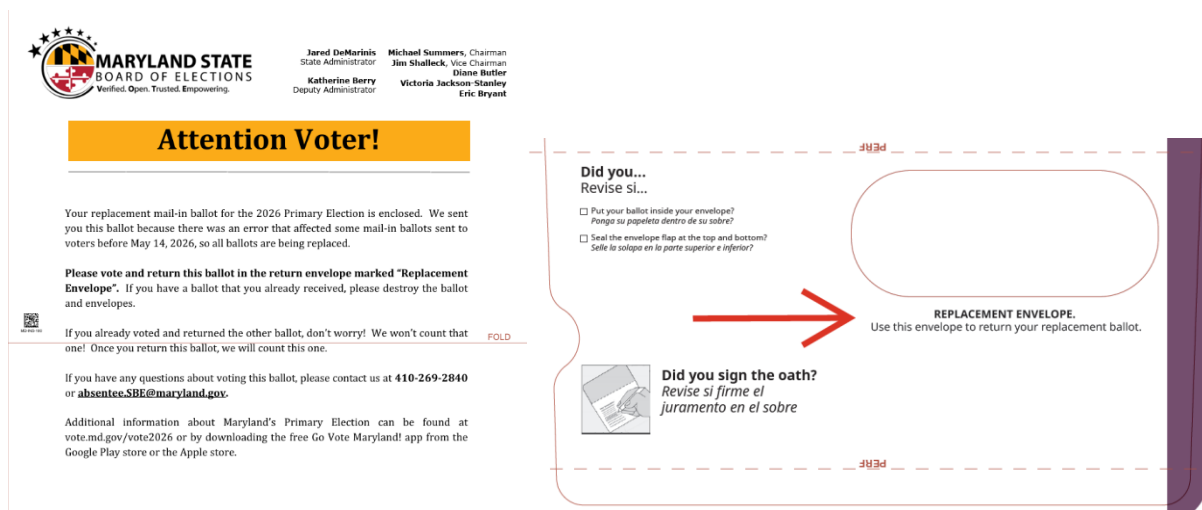
To help voters identify replacement ballots from the original ballots, the ballot envelope will have "REPLACEMENT BALLOT INSIDE." Production of replacement ballot packets will begin May 19, 2026 and mailing will be completed no later than May 29, 2026. Mailings will occur on a rolling basis as replacement ballots and envelopes are produced.

The process is essentially the same as voting any mail-in ballot, however the voter should return the "replacement ballot" in the envelope marked "replacement envelope," The original ballot received by voters should be destroyed. Special instructions will be enclosed.

SBE will utilize existing practices that prevent voters from having more than one ballot counted. As with all facets of the electoral process, there are additional safeguards to ensure only the correct ballot is being counted for each voter.

‘This is a travesty’: Northern Carroll County loses early voting, drop box site

For years, northern Carroll County voters had an early voting center and ballot drop box in the Hampstead area.

This year, both will move to Westminster — leaving District 2 as the only one without a ballot drop box and one of two without an early voting center. District 2 is in the northern part of Carroll and includes Finksburg, Hampstead and Manchester.

County election officials say the move was necessary because the 2024 site had scheduling and accessibility issues. Commissioner Ken Kiler, who represents District 2, said the removal makes voting more difficult for residents without reliable transportation.

“The problem is: We have no drop boxes; we have no early voting,” Kiler said. “You can’t vote early without paying somebody to drive you there. That’s unacceptable.”

The county will maintain three early voting centers and six ballot drop boxes, the same number as 2022 and 2024, Carroll County Election Director Erin Perrone said. In 2020, the county had two early voting centers and six ballot drop boxes.

In October, Perrone presented the Carroll County Board of Elections with a proposal to use Charles Carroll Community Center in Westminster as the new early-voting center and ballot drop box instead of Coppermine Pantherplex in Hampstead, which was used in the 2024 election.

Perrone said Coppermine could not commit to the room used during the 2024 election because the media center was being leased to another organization. The facility offered its gymnasium, but Perrone said election judges and voters with disabilities raised concerns about inaccessible parking during the 2024 primary.

Kiler questioned whether election officials did enough to keep the location in northern Carroll, saying he believes there was usable space at Coppermine or elsewhere in Finksburg, Hampstead or Manchester.

“If they can’t find a place acceptable in Hampstead, Manchester and Finksburg, I can find about 10 of them and they can take their pick,” Kiler said.

Perrone said election officials began researching alternatives in summer 2025 and considered other northern Carroll locations, including the Hampstead Volunteer Fire Department, a Hampstead library branch and the Manchester Fire Department Activities Building. Each had issues, she said.

The Hampstead Volunteer Fire Department was available for the primary but not the general election, and changing early voting centers between elections can confuse voters, she said. Other locations had issues with space, parking or security.

“Traditionally, a ballot drop box should be at every early voting center,” Perrone said, so the drop box also moved to Westminster.

The board voted in November not to add a seventh ballot drop box at the Manchester Police Department after Perrone estimated the cost at \$8,000 to \$11,000.

The decision leaves District 2 without a ballot drop box. Other districts have at least one, with some having two locations.

Kiler said the decision gives District 2 “the short end of the stick.”

“They did their best, probably, but they fell short,” Kiler said. “I think they made a mistake. Do I think it was intentional? No.”

Perrone said local officials were notified of the proposed changes in September.

“This is a travesty,” Kiler said. “Maybe I should’ve looked at this sooner. I just had no idea.”

Perrone said she does not anticipate the change lowering turnout and has not heard complaints from voters about the move.

Kiler disagreed, saying older residents, people with disabilities and voters without reliable transportation could be most affected.

“I talked to people at Hampstead that don’t own a car, so now they’ve got to pay to get to someplace or not do it,” Kiler said. “I want voting. Voting is our right, and I want it to be as easy as it can be for the citizens in my district.”

Residents may also vote in person at their [designated polling place](#) or apply for a mail-in ballot.

Kiler said adding another early voting center before the 2026 election is not realistic, but he hopes the county can at least add a ballot drop box in District 2 this year and restore both services to northern Carroll in future election cycles.

Perrone said adding a new ballot drop box before the primary is not realistic, and adding one later in the election cycle would still require additional funding and board approval.

To vote by mail in the primary election, applications must be received by 8 p.m. June 16, or 11:59 p.m. by email. Internet applications must be received by 5 p.m. June 19, or 11:59 p.m. by email.

Early voting for the 2026 primary is 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. June 11-18. Mail-in ballot drop boxes and polling locations close at 8 p.m. on election day, June 23.

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LOCAL BOARD POLICY – 2026.1

SB670/HB1001 – Election Law Authority at Polling Places, Early Voting Centers, and Counting Centers

SB670/HB1001 was passed by the General Assembly during its 2026 session. Election Law §10-311 (c)(1)(III) states:

“A designating person shall submit a copy of the certificate of an accredited challenger or watcher to the appropriate local board before the accredited challenger or watcher may enter the voting room.”

It will be the policy of the Carroll County Board of Elections to direct the Election Director to accept a certificate of an accredited challenger and watcher before 5:00 pm the day before each day of early voting or the day before election day. If the Election Director did not receive the certificate of an accredited challenger and watcher before 5:00 pm prior to each day of early voting or the day before election day, the chief judges at the early voting center or polling place will not permit access to the challenger/watcher to the voting location.
