The meeting of the Board of Canvassers began at 10:37 am on Wednesday, July 17, 2024, at the Robert Moton Building, 300 S Center Street, Westminster, MD 21157. There is a quorum present as required by Election Law section 11-3001(d). There is at least one member of the Board of Canvassers who is a registered voter of the principal minority party present as required by Election Law section 11-301(g).

Heather DeWees, the Clerk of the Court for Carroll County, administered and recorded the oath of each member of the Board of Canvassers on Wednesday, April 17, 2024. Ms. DeWees administered and recorded the oath for Board of Canvasser Coley on Friday, April 5, 2024. Ms. DeWees administered and recorded the oath for Board Counsel Gullo on Monday, May 13, 2024.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF OFFICERS

As required by Election Law section 11-301(b), the Board of Canvassers elected Samuel Foster as Chairman and Benjamin Watson as Secretary. Mr. Foster and Mr. Watson were elected on Wednesday, April 17, 2024.

PUBLIC NOTICE OF CANVASS

As required by COMAR 33.08.01.05-1, the public notice of the canvass was provided via the website and email to candidates, central committees, and other interested parties. The notice was also posted on our social media sites.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

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Ms. Perrone presented the minutes from the Mail-in Ballot and Provisional Canvasses. Ms. Coley made a motion to approve the minutes. Mr. Edelman seconded the motion, and the motion passed unanimously.

CANVASSING

Canvassing of Mail-in Ballots

Ms. Perrone reported that 24 mail-in ballots were received after the certification of the election. Mr. Edelman made a motion to reject the mail-in ballots as being untimely. Mr. Watson seconded the motion, and the motion passed unanimously.

CANVASSING STATISTICS

Ms. Perrone reported that 24 mail-in ballots were presented for canvassing and 6 mail-in ballots were rejected for being untimely.
